Bobbles and Stripes Baby Blanket



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Supplies/Materials:

Here is what you will need to make this baby blanket:

- A size H (5.0 mm) crochet hook
- Worsted weight yarn. I used Berroco Comfort (100g or 3.5 Oz per skein):
 - 5 skeins Pretty Pink (Colour A)
 - 1 skein Smokestack (Colour B)
- Scissors



Measurement:

This blanket measures 24" X 35"

Special Stitches:

SC: Single Crochet

CH: Chain

Bobble Stitch (BS): *Yarn Over, insert hook in specified stitch and draw up a loop. Repeat from * 3 times so that there are 7 loops on your hook. Yarn over and draw through the 7 loops on your hook.



Pattern:

With **Colour A**, Chain 114.

Row 1 (Right Side): SC in second chain from hook and in each remaining chain; CH 1, turn.

Row 2: SC in first sc, *BS in next sc, SC in next sc; repeat from * to end of row; CH1, turn.

Row 3: SC in each stitch to end of row; CH 1, turn.

Row 4: SC in first two sc, *BS in next sc, SC in next sc, BS in next sc; repeat from * to last two sc; SC in last two sc; CH1, turn.

Row 5: SC in each stitch to end of row; CH 1, turn.

Repeat rows 2-5 for the blanket pattern.

Once you have 16 rows (count 8 bobbles), switch to **Colour B** for two rows (1 row of bobbles).

****** Note, every time you switch colours, make sure that you switch at the end of a bobble row (repeat of row 2 or 4)******

Switch to **Colour A** and work 4 rows (2 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour B** and work 4 rows (2 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour A** and work 4 rows (2 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour B** and work two rows (1 row of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour A** and work 16 rows (8 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour B** and work two rows (1 row of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour A** and work 4 rows (2 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour B** and work 4 rows (2 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour A** and work 4 rows (2 rows of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour B** and work two rows (1 row of bobbles).

Switch to **Colour A** and work 16 rows (8 rows of bobbles).

You will end on a bobble row. Chain 1, turn, and work around the border of the blanket evenly in single crochet for 4 rounds. Make sure that you do 3 SC in each corner of the border. If you don't know how to do a single crochet border, this wonderful article: <https://www.crochetspot.com/crochet-finish-technique-crochet-evenly-around/> explains it in detail.

Fasten off and weave in ends!





Cozy Clusters Baby Blanket



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Supplies/Materials:

Here is what you will need to make this baby blanket:

- A size J-10 (6 mm) Crochet Hook
- 6 Skeins Knit Picks Mighty Stitch Bulky Yarn in Blush
- Scissors

Finished Size:

This blanket measures: 24 Inches X 30 Inches



Special Stitches:

Cluster Stitch (CL) *Yarn Over, insert hook into specified stitch and draw up a loop to the height of a DC; Yarn Over and draw through two loops; repeat from * two more times in same stitch; Yarn Over and draw through all four loops remaining on hook; Chain one.



Pattern:

Chain 82 (or an even number of stitches to customize the size).

Row 1: SC in 2nd chain from hook and in next chain; *CH1, skip next ch, SC in next ch; repeat from * across to last 3 chains, CH1, skip next ch, SC in last two chains; CH4 (counts as a DC and ch-1 space of following row), turn.

Row 2: *Skip the sc, CL in next ch-1 space, CH1; repeat from * to the last ch-1 space, CL in last ch-1 space, CH1, skip next sc, DC in last sc; CH1, turn.

Row 3: SC in first dc, SC in first ch-1 space; * CH1, skip next CL, SC in next ch-1 space; repeat from * across, ending last rep with SC in turning chain space, SC in 3rd chain of turning chain; CH4, turn.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until your work measures 29 inches long. Continue on to Border.



Border:

Work around the border of the blanket evenly in single crochet for 2 rounds. Make sure that you do 3 SC in each corner of the border. Fasten off and weave in the ends!



Victoria Baby Blanket



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Supplies:

Yarn: For this blanket I used [Knitpicks Mighty Stitch Yarn](#) in:

- Color A: Wisteria – 3 Skeins.
- Color B: Silver – 2.5 Skeins.

Hook: Size H (5 mm) crochet hook.

Measurement:

Finished blanket measures 30" wide X 38" long.

Abbreviations:

CH	Chain
SC	Single Crochet
HDC	Half Double Crochet
V-ST	V Stitch

Special Stitches:

V-Stitch: Work (1DC, 1CH, 1DC) in specified stitch.

Pattern:

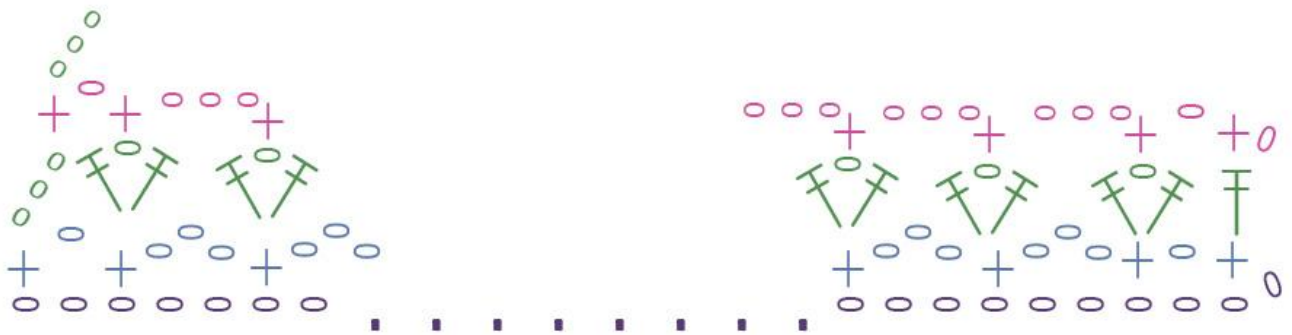
With Color A, CH 102.

Row 1: SC in second chain from hook, CH1, skip next ch, SC in next ch; *CH3, skip 2 chs, SC in next ch; repeat from * to last 2 chs, CH1, sk next ch, SC in last ch; CH3, turn.

Row 2: *V-ST in next sc; repeat from * to end of row, ending last rep with 1DC in last sc; CH1, turn.

Row 3: SC in first dc, CH1; *SC in ch1 space for next v-st, CH3; rep from * to end of row, ending last rep with CH1 (instead of CH3), SC in top of turning ch; CH3, turn.

See stitch guide below for a visual of the first 3 rows.



Repeat rows 2 and 3 until work measures 32 inches and continue to **Border/Edging.**



Border/Edging:

At the end of your last row for the body of the blanket, chain 1 and switch to Color B. The edging/border is worked in rounds around the blanket.

Round 1: SC all the way around the blanket, joining to first sc with a slip stitch. Note that you need to make 3 SC in each corner so that the ends do not curve inwards. Pay attention to how the blanket is laying. It should lay flat (no ruffling yet). Do not start round 2 until you are sure that you have an even border around the blanket in single crochet (as this is the foundation of your border). Round 2: CH2, and work 2HDC in each sc all the way around (this includes the stitch that you joined with a slip stitch). Join to first hdc with slip stitch.

Rounds 3-7: CH2, and work 1HDC in each hdc. Join to first hdc with a slip stitch.

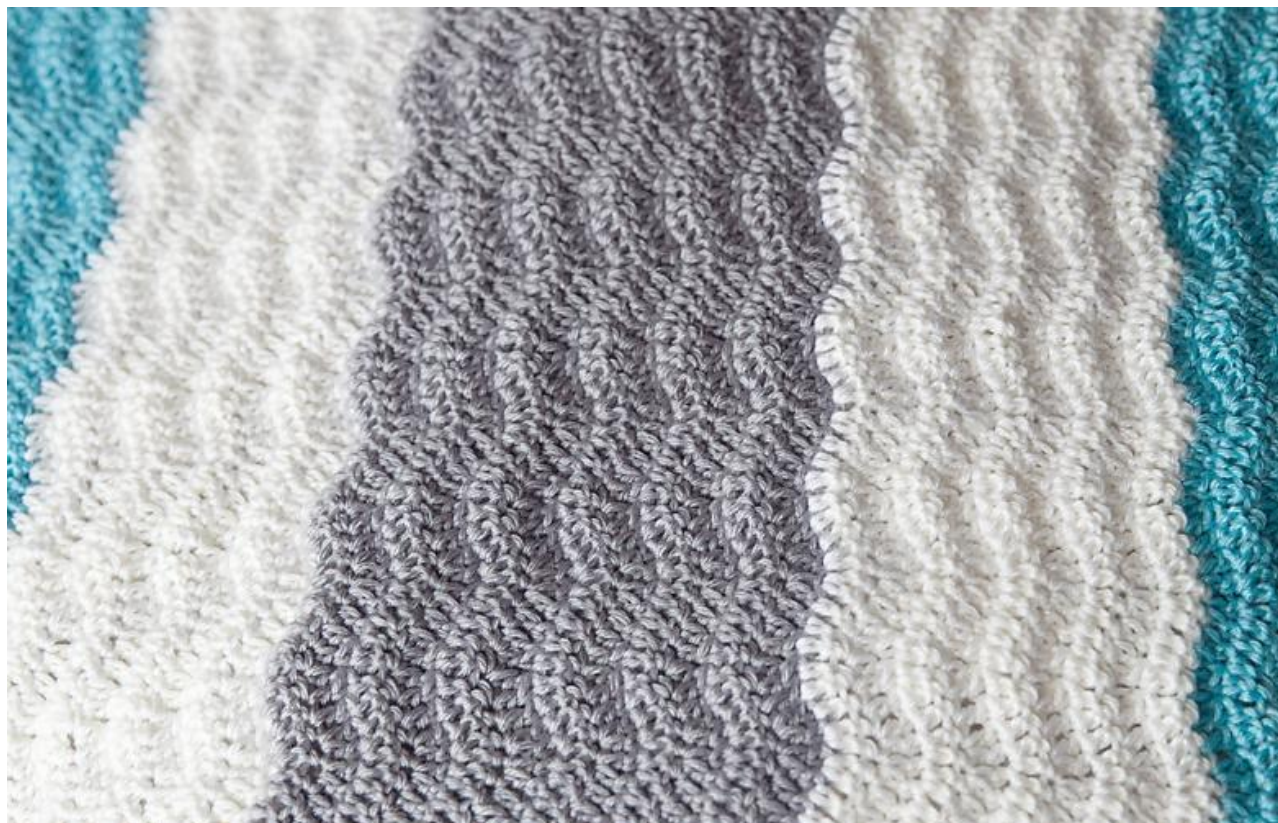
Finishing:

Weave in the loose ends.





Wavy Chevrons Baby Blanket



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Supplies:

Here is what you will need to make this baby blanket:

- A size H-8 (5 mm) Crochet Hook
- Knit Picks Mighty Stitch Yarn
 - 2 Skeins Sky (colour A)
 - 2 Skeins White (colour B)
 - 1.5 Skeins Silver (colour C)
- Scissors



Measurement:

This blanket measures: 26 Inches X 39.5 Inches

Pattern:

Note: This pattern uses the wavy chevron stitch. For all of you visual learners out there, I have created a [Video Tutorial](http://www.leeleeknits.com/wavy-chevron-crochet-stitch-video-tutorial/) on this stitch:

With Colour A, Chain 139.

Row 1: 1 DC in fourth ch from hook, 1 DC in next ch, [2DCTOG] twice, 1 DC in next ch, 2 DC in next ch, *2DC in next ch, 1DC in next ch, [2DCTOG] twice, 1 DC in next ch, 2 DC in next ch; repeat from * to end and turn.

Row 2: CH3, 1 DC in first dc, 1 DC in next dc, [2DCTOG] twice, 1 DC in next dc, 2 DC in next dc, *2 DC in next dc, 1 DC in next dc, [2DCTOG] twice, 1 DC in next dc, 2 DC in next dc; repeat from * to end of the row, working last 2 DC in the third ch of turning chain.





Repeat row 2 until you have worked 9 rows in total.

Switch to colour B and work 9 more rows in pattern.

Switch to colour C and work 12 more rows in pattern.

Switch to colour B and work 9 more rows in pattern.

Switch to colour A and work 9 more rows in pattern.

Fasten off and weave in all loose ends





Heirloom Baby Blanket



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Supplies:

- A size H-8 (5 mm) Crochet Hook
- 10 Skeins Cascade Cherub DK weight yarn in Smokey Lavender
- Scissors

Measurement:

This blanket measures: 35 Inches X 42 Inches.

Special Stitches:

Cluster Stitch (CL) *Yarn Over, insert hook into specified stitch and draw up a loop to the height of a DC; Yarn Over and draw through two loops; repeat from * two more times in same stitch; Yarn Over and draw through all four loops remaining on hook.



Pattern:

Chain 153 (or a multiple of 5 + 3 for a different width)

Row 1: CL in 6th chain from hook, *CH1, skip next two chains, DC in next chain; working in front of last dc made, DC in 2nd skipped chain, CH1, skip next chain, CL in next chain; repeat from * to last two chains, CH1, skip next chain, DC in last chain; CH4, turn.

Row 2: Skip first ch1 space, DC in next ch1 space; working in front of last dc made, DC in skipped ch1 space; *CH1, CL in space between next 2 dc, CH1, skip next ch1 space, DC in next ch1 space; working in front of last dc made, DC in skipped ch1 space; repeat from * to end of row, CH1, DC in 3rd chain of turning chain; CH4, turn.

Row 3: CL in space between next 2 dc, CH1; *skip next ch1 space, DC in next ch1 space; working in front of last dc made, DC in skipped ch1 space; CH1, CL in space between next two dc, CH1; repeat from * to end of row, DC in 3rd chain of turning chain; CH4, turn.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until your work measures 40 inches and continue on to border.



Border:

Round 1: Work around the border of the blanket evenly in single crochet. Make sure that you do 3 SC in each corner of the border. If you don't know how to do a single crochet border, this wonderful article explains it in detail. When you have completed one round, join to first sc with a slip stitch.

Round 2: CH 2, work around the border by doing one HDC in each SC (work 3 HDC in each corner sc). At the end of the round, join to first HDC with a slip stitch.

Round 3: CH2, work around the border again by doing one HDC in each HDC (Work 3 HDC in each corner hdc). At the end of the round, join to first HDC with a slip stitch.

Fasten off and weave in all loose ends.



Vintage Chic Baby Blanket



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Materials

Here is what you will need to make this super soft and cozy baby blanket:

- A size H (5 mm) crochet hook
- Berroco Comfort Worsted Weight Yarn:
 - Main Colour: 5 Skeins of Berroco Comfort worsted weight yarn in Pearl (9702)
 - Second Colour: 1 Skein of Berroco Comfort worsted weight yarn in Lavender Frost (9715)
- Scissors

Measurements:

This baby blanket measures 24.5" X 33"

Special Stitches:

Shell: (1SC, CH2, 4DC) in same ch or stitch.

Pattern:

Using your main colour, chain 102.

Row 1: Shell in 2nd ch from hook; *skip 3 ch, shell in next ch; repeat from * to last 4 ch; skip 3 ch, 1SC in last ch; CH3, turn.

Row 2: 2DC in first sc; *shell in next ch2 space; repeat from * to last ch2 space; 1SC in last ch2 space; CH3, turn.

Row 3: 2 DC in first sc; *shell in next ch2 space; repeat from * to turning chain space; 1 SC in turning chain space; CH3, turn.

Repeat row 3 until your work measures approx 23 inches (or desired length). At the end of the last row, switch to your second colour, CH1, turn.

Edging:

Round 1: Work around the border of the blanket evenly in single crochet. Make sure that you do 3 SC in each corner of the border. If you don't know how to do a single crochet border, this wonderful article explains it in detail. When you have completed one round, join to first sc with a slip stitch.

Note: The top of the blanket is a little bit confusing for the first round since there are shells and not a straight row to work off of. For the top row of the border, what you need to do is: CH1 and switch to your new colour. Then, work 3SC in the first sc. After that, work 1SC in each dc (each shell represents 4 stitches so you want to make 4 SC per shell). You will know you are doing it correctly because the top will start to straighten out. Once you reach the end of the row, work 3 SC in the top of the turning chain and continue to work around the border in single crochet.

Round 2: CH2, work (3 DC, 1 SC) in same stitch; *skip 3 sc, work (4DC, 1 SC) in next sc; repeat from * all the way around the border of the blanket. Join to beginning of the round with a slip stitch.

Fasten off and weave in all loose ends.
