



Classic Cabled Baby Blanket

Yarn:

5 skeins (550 yards) of Knit Picks Swish Worsted Weight Yarn in Wonderland Heather.

Knitting Needles:

14 inch long straight US 10.5 (6.5 mm).

Measurements:

Finished blanket measures 24" wide X 37" long.

Gauge:

4.5 rows, 4.5 stitches = 1 inch in stockinette stitch.

Abbreviations:

K	Knit
P	Purl
C4F	Cable 4 Front (slip 2 stitches onto your cable needle to the front of your work, knit the next two stitches, then knit the two stitches off of the cable needle).
C4B	C4B: Cable 4 Back (slip 2 stitches onto your cable needle to the back of your work, knit the next two stitches, then knit the two stitches off of the cable needle).

Pattern:

Cast on 114 stitches.

Row 1: *K1, P1; repeat from * to end of row.

Row 2: *P1, K1; repeat from * to end of row.

Row 3: *K1, P1; repeat from * to end of row.

Row 4: *P1, K1; repeat from * to end of row.

Row 5: K1, P1, K1, *P2, K8, P2; repeat from * to last 3 stitches; P1, K1, P1.

Row 6: P1, K1, P1, *K2, P8, K2; repeat from * to last 3 stitches; K1, P1, K1.

Row 7: K1, P1, K1, *P2, K8, P2; repeat from * to last 3 stitches; P1, K1, P1.

Row 8: P1, K1, P1, *K2, P8, K2; repeat from * to last 3 stitches; K1, P1, K1.

Row 9: K1, P1, K1, *P2, C4B, C4F, P2; repeat from * to last 3 stitches; P1, K1, P1.

Row 10: P1, K1, P1, *K2, P8, K2; repeat from * to last 3 stitches; K1, P1, K1.

Repeat rows 5-10 until your work measures approximately 26 inches long.

Repeat rows 1-4 to finish off the border.

Cast off your stitches in pattern.

Finishing:

Weave in the loose ends with a yarn needle.

At this point, the blanket will measure 19" wide X 27" long. You will need to wet block the blanket in order for it to lengthen to its final measurement of 24" wide X 37" long. After wet blocking, the stitches will also look more defined and evenly spaced. Below is a photo of how the blanket will look before and after wet blocking.
