

Winter Hats

A Collection of Six Fun and Stylish Patterns



Chunky Cable Knit Beanie



Materials

- Size 10 (6 mm) 16" circular knitting needles
- Size 10 (6 mm) double pointed knitting needles
- Cable needle
- Stitch Marker
- 1-2 Skeins Bulky weight yarn: [Knit Picks Mighty Stitch Bulky Weight Yarn](#)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle

Gauge

16 stitches, 18 rows = 4 Inches

Sizes:

Baby(Child, Adult)

Abbreviations:

K: Knit

K2Tog: Knit Two Together

P: Purl

P2Tog: Purl Two Together

C6F: Cable 6 Front (slip 3 stitches onto your cable needle to the front of your work, knit the next three stitches, then knit the three stitches off of the cable needle).

Pattern

Using circular needles, cast on 63(72, 81) stitches. Place stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

Round 1-6: *P3, K6; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 7: *P3, C6F; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 8: *P3, K6; repeat from * to end of round.

Repeat rounds one through eight 2(3, 4) more times.

Now we start decreasing to shape the top of the hat (you will need to switch to double pointed needles at some point if you are making a smaller size):

Decreasing Rounds:

Round 1: *P1, P2Tog, K6; repeat from * to end of round. 56(64, 72) stitches remain.

Round 2: *P2, K6; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 3: *P2Tog, K6; repeat from * to end of round. 49(56, 63) stitches remain.

Round 4: *P1, K6; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 5: *P1, K2, K2Tog, K2; repeat from * to end of round. 42(48, 54) stitches remain.

Round 6: *P1, K5; repeat from * to end of round.

Continue to ***Finishing***

Finishing:

Cut yarn (leave a long tail) and pull through yarn needle. Thread through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure and weave in ends.







The Coziest Winter Hat



Materials:

Here is what you will need to make this adorable winter hat:

- 16" US11/8 mm circular knitting needles.
- US 11/8 mm double pointed needles
- One Hank (110 yards) [Knit Picks Biggo Yarn](#) in Bare.
- Stitch Marker.
- Scissors.
- Yarn Needle.

Gauge:

3.25 stitches = 1 Inch in stockinette stitch

Sizes:

Adult

Note: Adult head circumference = 22 inches

Abbreviations:

K: Knit

K2Tog: Knit Two Together

P: Purl

Pattern:

This hat is worked in the round. Using circular needles, cast on 48 Stitches. Place the stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round and join being careful not to twist your work.

Rounds 1-9: *K1, P1; repeat from * to end of round to make 1X1 ribbing.

Round 10-11: Knit all stitches.

Round 12: *P1, K5; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 13: P2, *K3, P3; repeat from * to last 5 stitches, k3, P1.

Round 14: *P2, K1; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 15: K1, *P3, K3; repeat from * to last 5 stitches, P3, K2.

Round 16: K2, *P1, K5; repeat from * to last 4 stitches, P1, K3.

Round 17-21: Knit all stitches.

Repeat rounds 12-21 one more time.

Start decreasing to shape the top of the hat (switch to double pointed needles when necessary):

Round 1: *K6, K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (42 stitches remain).

Round 2: Knit all stitches.

Round 3: *K5, K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (36 stitches remain).

Round 4: Knit all stitches.

Round 5: *K4, K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (30 stitches remain).

Round 6: Knit all stitches.

Round 7: *K3, K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (24 stitches remain).

Round 8: Knit all stitches.

Round 9: *K2, K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (18 stitches remain).

Round 10: Knit all stitches. Continue to finishing.





Finishing:

Cut yarn (leave a long tail) and pull through yarn needle. Thread through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure and weave in ends.





Diamond Cables Knit Beanie



Materials

- Size 10 (6 mm) 16" circular knitting needles
- Size 10 (6 mm) double pointed knitting needles
- Cable needle
- Stitch Marker
- 1-2 Skeins bulky weight yarn: I used James C. Brett Chunky with Merino in Color 9
- Scissors
- Yarn needle

Gauge

16 stitches, 18 rows = 4 Inches

Sizes:

Baby(Child, Adult)

Abbreviations:

K: Knit

K2Tog: Knit Two Together

P: Purl

C4B: Cable 4 Back (slip 2 stitches onto your cable needle to the back of your work, knit the next two stitches, then knit the two stitches off of the cable needle).

C4F: Cable 4 Front (slip 2 stitches onto your cable needle to the front of your work, knit the next two stitches, then knit the two stitches off of the cable needle).

Pattern:

Using circular needles, cast on 60(72, 84) stitches. Place stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

The rim of the hat is worked in a Knit 1, Purl 1 rib stitch:

For 7(8, 9) rounds: *K1, P1; repeat from * to end of round.

Start working the diamond cable pattern:

Rounds 1-2: Knit all stitches.

Round 3: *C4B, K4, C4F; repeat from * to end of round.

Rounds 4-6: Knit all stitches.

Round 7: *K2, C4F, C4B, K2; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 8: Knit all stitches.

Repeat rounds one through eight 2(3,4) more times.

Now we start decreasing to shape the top of the hat (you will need to switch to double pointed needles at some point if you are making a smaller size):

Decreasing Rounds:

Round 1: *K3(4,5), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 48(60,72) stitches remain.

Round 2: Knit all stitches.

Round 3: *K2(3,4), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 36(48,60) stitches remain.

Round 4: Knit all stitches.

Round 5: *K1(2,3), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 24(36,48) stitches remain. Continue on to ***Finishing***.

Finishing:

Cut yarn (leave a long tail) and pull through yarn needle. Thread the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure and weave in ends.





Chunky Textured Beanie Pattern



Materials

- Size 10.75 (7 mm) 16" circular knitting needles.
- Size 10.75 (7 mm) double pointed knitting needles.
- Stitch Marker.
- 1 Skein (137 yards) Bulky Weight Yarn.
- Scissors.
- Yarn needle.
- Fur pom pom (or you can make your own with remaining yarn).

Gauge

14 stitches, 18 rows = 4 Inches.

Sizes:

Child (Adult)

Note: Adult head circumference = 22 inches;
Child head circumference = 20 inches.

Abbreviations:

K: Knit

K2Tog: Knit Two Together

P: Purl



Pattern Instructions

This hat is knit in the round. Using circular needles, cast on 60(70) stitches. Place stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

Rounds 1-10: *k1,P1; repeat from * to end of round to create ribbing for the rim of the hat.

Round 11: Knit All Stitches.

Round 12: Knit All Stitches.

Round 13: Knit All Stitches.

Round 14: *K1, P1 until end of round.

Repeat rounds 11-14 six(seven) more times.

Now we start decreasing to shape the top of the hat (you can switch to double pointed needles when necessary):

Decreasing Rounds:

Round 1: *K4(5), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 50(60) stitches remain.

Round 2: Knit all stitches.

Round 3: *K3(4), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 40(50) stitches remain.

Round 4: *K1, P1 until end of round.

Round 5: *K2(3), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 30(40) stitches remain.

Round 6: Knit all stitches.

Round 7: *K1(2), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 20(30) stitches remain.

Continue to finishing.

Finishing:

Cut yarn (leave a long tail) and pull through yarn needle. Thread through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure and weave in ends.

Braided Cable Knit Beanie



Materials:

- Size 10.5 (6.5 mm) 16" circular knitting needles
- Size 10.5 (6.5 mm) double pointed knitting needles
- Cable needle
- Stitch Marker
- 1 Skein Bulky weight yarn: [Paintbox Yarns Simply Chunky](#) in Duck Egg Blue
- Scissors
- Yarn needle

Gauge:

16 stitches, 18 rows = 4 Inches

Sizes:

Adult (head circumference 22 inches)

Abbreviations:

K: Knit

K2Tog: Knit Two Together

P: Purl

P2Tog: Purl Two Together

C6F: Cable 6 Front (slip 3 stitches onto your cable needle to the front of your work, knit the next three stitches, then knit the three stitches off of the cable needle).

C6B: Cable 6 Back (slip 3 stitches onto your cable needle to the back of your work, knit the next three stitches, then knit the three stitches off of the cable needle).

Pattern:

This hat is knit in the round. Using circular needles, cast on 80 stitches. Place stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

Rounds 1-10: *k2,P2; repeat from * to end of round to create 2X2 ribbing for the rim of the hat.

Round 11: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 12: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 13: *C6F, C6F, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 14: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 15: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 16: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 17: *K3, C6B, K3, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Round 18: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round.

Repeat rounds 11-18 two more times.

Now we start decreasing to shape the top of the hat (you can switch to double pointed needles when necessary):

Decreasing Rounds:

Round 1: *K12, P4; repeat from * to end of round (80 stitches remain).

Round 2: *k12, P2, P2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (75 stitches remain).

Round 3: *C6F, C6F, P3; repeat from * to end of round. (75 stitches remain).

Round 4: *k12, P1, P2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (70 stitches remain).

Round 5: *K12, P2; repeat from * to end of round (70 stitches remain).

Round 6: *k12, P2Tog; repeat from * to end of round (65 stitches remain).

Round 7: *K3, C6B, K3, P1; repeat from * to end of round (65 stitches remain).

Round 8: *k10, K2Tog, P1; repeat from * to end of round (60 stitches remain).

Round 9: *K11, P1; repeat from * to end of round (60 stitches remain).

Round 10: *K4, K2tog, K3, k2tog, P1; repeat from * to end of round (50 stitches remain).

Continue to ***Finishing***.



Finishing:

Cut yarn (leave a long tail) and pull through yarn needle. Thread through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure and weave in ends.

Slouchy Winter Beanie Pattern



Materials

- Size 10.75 (7 mm) 16" circular knitting needles.
- Size 10.75 (7 mm) double pointed knitting needles.
- Stitch Marker.
- 1 Skein (137 yards) Bulky Weight Yarn.
- Scissors.
- Yarn needle.
- Fur pom pom (or you can make your own with remaining yarn).

Gauge

14 stitches, 18 rows = 4 Inches.

Sizes:

Child (Adult)

Note: Adult head circumference = 22 inches;
Child head circumference = 20 inches.

Abbreviations:

K: Knit

K2Tog: Knit Two Together

P: Purl



Pattern Instructions

This hat is knit in the round. Using circular needles, cast on 64(72) stitches. Place stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

Rounds 1-10: *k2,P2; repeat from * to end of round to create 2X2 ribbing for the rim of the hat.

Round 11: Knit All Stitches.

Round 12: Purl All Stitches.

Round 13: Knit All Stitches.

Round 14: Purl All Stitches.

Round 15: Knit All Stitches.

Round 16: Purl All Stitches.

Round 17: Knit All Stitches.

Round 18: Purl All Stitches.

Round 19: Knit All Stitches.

Continue to knit all stitches (working in stockinette stitch) in the round until your work measures 4.25" (child) or 5" (adult).

Now we start decreasing to shape the top of the hat (you can switch to double pointed needles when necessary):

Decreasing Rounds:

Round 1: *K6(7), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 56(64) stitches remain.

Round 2: Knit all stitches.

Round 3: *K5(6), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 48(56) stitches remain.

Round 4: Knit all stitches.

Round 5: *K4(5), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 40(48) stitches remain.

Round 6: Knit all stitches.

Round 7: *K3(4), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 32(40) stitches remain.

Round 8: Knit all stitches.

Round 9: *K2(3), K2Tog; repeat from * to end of round. 24(32) stitches remain.

Continue to finishing.

Finishing:

Cut yarn (leave a long tail) and pull through yarn needle. Thread through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure and weave in ends.
