



THE SEASIDE BABY BLANKET
KNITTING PATTERN

Materials:

Here is what you will need to make this baby blanket:

- US 10.5 (or 6.5 mm) Knitting Needles (14" if using straight, 32" if using circular).
- 4 Skeins of [Paintbox Yarns Simply Aran Yarn](#) in Stormy Grey
- Scissors.
- Tapestry/Yarn needle to weave in ends.

Measurements:

Finished blanket measures 32" X 36".

Gauge:

18 rows, 14 stitches = 4 inches in stockinette stitch.

Abbreviations:

K	Knit
P	Purl

Pattern:

Cast on 109 Stitches (or a multiple of 12 plus 1 if you want to change the width).

Rows 1-8 (bottom border): *K1, P1; repeat from * to last stitch, K1.

Row 9: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1; *K1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 10: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P6, K3; *P9, K3, repeat from * to last 11 stitches; P6, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 11: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1; *K1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 12: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P5, K5; *P7, K5, repeat from * to last 10 stitches; P5, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 13: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1; *K1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 14: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P4, K3, P1, K3; *P5, K3, P1, K3, repeat from * to last 9 stitches; P4, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 15: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1; *K1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 16: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1; *P3, K3, repeat from * to last 8 stitches; P3, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 17: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1; *K1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 18: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P2, *K3; P5, K3, P1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 19: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1; *K1, repeat from * to last 6 stitches; P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Row 20: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, *P1, repeat from * to last 5 stitches; K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

Repeat rows 9-20 until work measures 34.5 inches.

Repeat rows 1-8 to complete top border.

Cast off in pattern and weave in the loose ends with a yarn needle.
